Pheobe Dong, Orchestra Director

This is Pheobe Dong's first year directing the MVSD orchestra. "It is very apparent how much the students care about and love music," says Pheobe, adding, "It is a joy to teach them everyday and bring the best out of each student." Orchestra programs begin in 4th grade with beginning orchestra, moving up through 8th grade with intermediate and advanced groups. Highlights of the middle school orchestra programs include:

- 2006. CMEA Festival unanimous Superior ranking.
- 2006. Disneyland Music Festival.
- 2007. CMEA Festival unanimous Superior ranking
- 2008. Advanced Orchestra will compete in Music in the Parks Music Festival April 25th

The middle school orchestra program now supports two orchestras with a total of 42 students. The elementary string program of 4th and 5th grade students includes approximately 100 students.



Kidido! MVMS Computer Update

Kidido! is proud to announce a one-time contribution of \$20,000 to the Mill Valley Middle School to provide a new computer learning station in the library. Together with the MVMS Parent Teacher Student Association, Kidido!'s contribution helped to purchase twenty new IMacs and a printer, for a total cost of \$25,000. According to MVMS principal Matt Huxley, this is an essential purchase as the current number of computers (ten) is not adequate to serve all of the students who use the library both during and after school.

Celebrating Kiddo's Award-Winning Music Programs

Thanks to the generosity of our parent community, the commitment of our teachers and the talent and hard work of our students, the Mill Valley School District can boast of an award-winning music program. Kidido! funds an array of musical opportunities for children from Kindergarten through 8th grade – a program that is unparalleled in most California public schools. Our outstanding music teachers build a strong musical foundation for all students in the elementary schools. Then in the middle school years, our students' many talents start to shine brightly through organized concerts and competitions.

Jessica Stewart, Choral Director

The MVSD choral program has grown every year since its inception in 2000. Today, almost 500 3rd through 8th grade students sing each week and perform several times throughout the school year. Nora Thomas, our exceptional K-2nd grade classroom music teacher, teaches 3rd- 4th grade chorus, and Jessica Stewart teaches 5th through 8th grade chorus. "I love teaching in this community because the parents are so appreciative and supportive," says Stewart. "The students really work together well as a team, and will accept and rise to every challenge," she adds. The Middle School program has over 200 students each year, including a 6th Grade Chorus and a Concert Choir and Bel Canto for 7th-8th graders. Each year the 7th and 8th grade vocalists participate in an off-campus festival. Some of the recent choral awards include:



- 2005. Music in the Parks Festival. All three competing choirs received a Superior rating, the highest honor Chamber Choir also received the Overall Choir Award. We are especially proud that all of our choirs received the "Esprit de Corps"- an award for spirit, enthusiasm, and professional demeanor.
- 2006. Students were accepted to and participated in Disney's Magic Music Days. The choirs performed inside Disneyland Park and participated (worked on their vocal and performance skills?) in a music workshop.
- 2007. Music in the Parks Festival. Two of our choirs received an Excellent rating, and one choir received a Superior. The Chamber Choir also received Overall Choir award. Again this year, all choirs received the "Esprit de Corps" award.
- 2008. Students were accepted to and participated in Disney's Magic Music Days. They will also perform at the Music in the Parks Festival in April.

Cayce Carnahan, Band Director

Each year the Kidido! funded band program enrolls 175 students. Fifth graders play in Beginning Band, 6th graders in Intermediate Band and 7th graders in Advanced Band. There is also a Wind Ensemble for 7th and 8th grade musicians and a celebrated Jazz Band for talented 6th-8th graders.



"I believe that the band program in Mill Valley is so successful because of the incredible parent and community support," explains Cayce Carnahan, band director since 2000. "I also have very high expectations for the bands, and the students are not afraid of working hard to get the most out of their abilities," he says. The MVSD bands compete in festivals every year, with some highlights including:

- 2003 Music in the Parks. Wind Ensemble received a unanimous Superior ranking and 1st place overall.
- 2005 CMEA Festival. Wind Ensemble received a unanimous Superior ranking.
- 2007 Music in the Parks. Wind Ensemble received a unanimous Superior ranking and 3rd place overall.
- 2007 Music in the Parks. Jazz Band received a unanimous Superior ranking and 1st place overall.
